General Information:

The governing body of each taxing district (city, school district, etc.) prepares their budget of expenditures. Based on the amount of tax to be levied to fund the budget and the estimated assessed valuation for the district, they compute an estimated mill levy. Each year the governing body of the taxing district shall certify, on or before August 25th, the approved budget including the amount of ad valorem tax to be levied.

The County Clerk computes the mill levy, within the statutory limits, for each taxing district. The amount of ad valorem tax to be levied and the current assessed valuation of the district determine the final mill levy.

The mill levies for each taxing district for your taxing unit are compiled, resulting in the total mill levy used in computing the ad valorem tax for your property. In addition to the ad valorem tax there may be city or county special assessments on real estate property.

A mill is a monetary unit equal to 1/1000 of a U.S. Dollar or 1/10 of a cent. One mill on a \$1,000 assessed value will raise \$1.00 in taxes.

Appraisals are conducted by the County Appraiser's Office. Please contact that office [(913) 829-9500] for questions regarding valuations.

The first half property taxes are due December 20th of the current year and the second half by May 10th of the following year. Taxes are collected by the Treasurer's Office. Contact the Treasurer's Office at (913) 715-2600 for questions regarding payments.
